The second book about the McDonnell Clan can be read as a standalone story. It was a Quarter Finalist in 2014's Amazon's Breakthrough Novel Award competition. Reviewers said it "grips from the beginning" and is "not to be missed." EB PB

In 1842, Catriona, unwilling to be left behind by her husband Dougal McDonnell, disguises herself as a boy to work for the Hudson's Bay Company. Within a few days of landing at York Factory on Hudson's Bay, Cat is assigned to work at the trading post, but Dougal is ordered west to Fort Vancouver and the Pacific Northwest—abandoning Cat. Rugged terrain and thousands of miles separate them. How will Cat survive alone? Will she and Dougal be reunited? EB PB
